**Answer:** Christianity teaches that there is only one God, and that God is the God of all people. While other religions may have gods or spiritual beings, these are not the true God of Christianity. Christians believe that the one true God is revealed in the Trinity—Father, Son (Jesus), and Holy Spirit. The belief in one God, who is the Creator and sustainer of everything, is central to Christianity.

- *Isaiah 45:5* says, “I am the Lord, and there is no other; apart from me there is no God.”

The reason the Bible focuses on Israel, particularly in the Old Testament, is that God chose them to be a witness to the nations

Christians believe that the same God who revealed Himself to Israel also interacts with all people. God is the Creator of all people. While He worked through Israel, His plan of salvation is for everyone, and it’s fulfilled through Jesus Christ. God desires all people to be saved and come to know Him.

Even though God’s actions in Israel were significant, Jesus Christ, who is fully God and fully man, came to save all people—not just those in Israel.
