

If there is only one Jesus then how is he at every Mass?

Answer: The key to understanding this is that Jesus' presence in the Eucharist is not a physical, bodily presence in the way we normally understand human presence, but rather a sacramental and real presence.

Since God is not bound by time and space, Jesus—who is fully divine—can be truly present in every Eucharist around the world while still being one person. This is a mystery of faith, meaning it's something beyond full human comprehension but believed through faith in God's power.

The Eucharist doesn't mean Jesus is sacrificed again. Instead, every Mass makes the one sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross present to us again. Jesus is present at every Mass because, as God, He is not limited by space or time. The Eucharist makes His one sacrifice on the Cross available to us everywhere.

CCC 1367: "The sacrifice of Christ and the sacrifice of the Eucharist are one single sacrifice: 'The victim is one and the same: the same now offers through the ministry of priests, who then offered himself on the cross; only the manner of offering is different.'"
